Welcome to **Northshore's School of Arts and Enrichment Summer Program!**

The **Northshore School of Arts and Enrichment** is a program that offers a great selection of summer classes, sports camps, private and group tutoring and private and group music lessons.

This is a separate summer program from Northshore Christian's R.E.A.L. Summer Adventure Program. Children from our community are invited and welcome to take these classes even if they are NOT enrolled at Northshore Christian Academy or don't attend the R.E.A.L. Summer Adventure Program.

This is the 6th year that our Summer Enrichment program has been in existence. Every year we expand our program and offer a variety of classes to meet the needs parents and children in our community. Many of our students attend the program each year and tell their neighbors or friends about it! Therefore space is limited and some classes fill up very quickly!

Here is the purpose of our program.

Northshore School of the Arts and Enrichment 2011 Exists: So that your child will:

- develop and continue to love learning and to pursue music and the arts
- learn a different way, with unique methods of learning –all in smaller classroom sizes
- learn skills that are introduced, practiced and that impacts their future
- be prepared for the upcoming school year
- have inter-active and fun learning opportunities
- continue to grow and learn during the long summer break from school
- have the option of tutoring – catching them up, keeping them where they should be, or preparing them for the upcoming school year.
- be exposed to career opportunity by hands-on knowledge and learning (for Example: Art, business opportunities, engineering, career protocol, sport's and teamwork, designing, the fun in Math and reading....etc.

This handbook has been designed to help families choose the enrichment classes, private and group tutoring, or private music lesson opportunities that best suit their child's needs and interests. The offerings are based on enhancing and expanding the academic learning of **students**. Summers can be long and parents and kids are always looking for things to do!

Don't miss this opportunity for fun, learning and expanding **your** child's interests and helping them develop and keep strong academic skills before the new school year begins!

SUMMER CLASS INFORMATION

The **Northshore School of Arts and Enrichment** is excited to offer a great selection of summer classes. Classes have low class sizes, interesting ways of learning a topic and a lot of hands on learning. This is unique to our program since all our teachers are state certified and have experience in teaching. Teachers are able to prepare lessons that they may normally not be able to prepare during the regular school year. The skills your child will be learning will expand their horizons and expose them to the love of learning and creating.

PRIVATE or GROUP TUTORING INFORMATION

Northshore School of the Arts and Enrichment offers a wide variety of private and group tutoring opportunities at Northshore Christian Academy. Teachers, who are certified by the State of Washington or in their field of expertise, will provide your child with a well-rounded and personalized, one on one learning opportunity. This will give them the tools needed to prepare them for the upcoming school year.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT THE PROGRAM

► *What ages of children or grade levels may attend the Art's and Enrichment classes and tutoring sessions?*

Students going into 1st – 9th grade this fall (2011) may attend the School of the Art's and Enrichment classes. Exceptions may be made. (Contact the director)

► *Does my child need to be registered in the R.E.A.L Summer Adventure Program or At Northshore Christian Academy in order to attend the Northshore's School of the Art and Enrichment Classes?*

No, your child does not need to be enrolled in any other programs at Northshore Christian Academy.

► *If my child is registered for the R.E.A.L Summer Adventure Program on a particular week, may he/she register for Northshore's School of the Arts and Enrichment during that same week and is there an additional cost?*

Students registered in the R.E.A.L Summer Adventure Program may register for Northshore's School of the Arts and Enrichment classes. Teachers in the R.E.A.L. Program will take students to class, then pick them up after the class and take them back to their camp activities. There is an additional cost for each enrichment class as well as the required, one time, non-refundable \$35.00 registration fee.

► Why do times vary or there are many weeks with only 4 days of Enrichment classes?

We draft our schedule based on the R.E.A.L. Summer Adventure Program's activities (field trips and major activities) so that children registered in the R.E.A.L. Program may attend the enrichment classes without missing the highlights of their week.

- **CLASSES**: Students will have a total of 7.5 hours of instruction during the week for each class they are enrolled in.
- **PRIVATE TUTORING**: Students receive 5 hours of private tutoring. (Times and Dates are negotiable to meet your schedule.) More sessions can be added after the minimum of 5 have been completed.
- **PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS**: Students will receive ½ hour, one-to-one training from professional musicians. There is a 5 session minimum.

► **How do I enroll my child in an Enrichment Classes or in Private Tutoring/Music Session?**

- **REGISTRATION:** Complete the Northshore's School of the Arts and Enrichment Registration form. *One per student.* This registration form covers all the classes, private and group tutoring and private and group music lessons.
- **REGISTRATION FEE:** A non-refundable, one time registration fee of \$35.00 is assessed per child, per summer. (NOT BY CLASS) (This fee is waived if you are ONLY taking the ARTWORKSHOP class(s).)
- **CHECK OFF CLASS LIST:** Enclosed in the registration packet is a CHECK OFF LIST. This is an official document.
All the classes, private and group tutoring, private or group music opportunities are listed on this check off list. Check off the classes you would like your child to be enrolled in this summer. (Fill out details under tutoring opportunities so that we can make arrangements with you and the teacher for determining schedules.

*Changes cannot be made once the registration has been turned in to the registrar, Trisha Galindo. A registration form must be completed per child and a non-refundable \$35.00 registration fee must accompany the Registration form and Check Off List Form.

- **PAYMENTS:** Payments for enrichment classes and/or sessions must be paid on the 1st of each month or if you enroll your child after the first of the month, the classes and/or sessions must be paid in full. For example, if you register in April, you will be billed for June classes you signed up for the month of June. If you register after MAY 15th – At registration you owe 100% for the classes you sign up for the month of June. Thereafter, you will be billed by the month.

A late payment fee of \$35.00 will be assessed after the due date. Make your checks out to NCA. We do not take credit cards.

REMEMBER: If you have signed up for a class, you will be charged full tuition whether or not your child attends the class. We purchase supplies and hire staff well in advance of the class and reserve space in the class for your child.

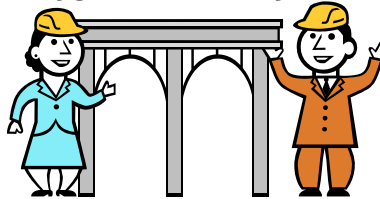
- **ADDITIONAL CLASSES OR CANCELATION OF CLASSES:** Provided there is enough interest, we may add additional classes. Northshore's School of the Arts and Enrichment has the right to cancel or add classes, tutoring opportunities or private music lessons for any reason. You will be notified of any changes. If a class has been cancelled, you will be given the option to be reimbursed or sign up for another class.
- **CLASS SIZE LIMITS:** OUR CLASS SIZES ARE VERY SMALL COMPARED TO OTHER PROGRAMS! Enrollment in all Northshore's School of the Arts and Enrichment classes will be limited. Since many of these classes will fill up, early registration is desirable. When requests for a class exceed the enrollment limitation, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in the order received. Additional space and/or classes may be added. *HURRY SPACE IS LIMITED!!*

 - Classes: as listed below or on the Check Off Form
 - **Academic Tutoring:** 1 hour sessions (5 session minimum)
 - Group – As listed below or on the Check Off Form
 - Private- \$35.00 per hour session (5 session minimum)

- **Private Music Lessons:** per lesson, ½ hour sessions
 - Group - \$25.00 per lesson (5 session minimum)
 - Private - \$30.00 per lesson (5 session minimum)

BUILDING BRIDGES

Grades 1-3, 9:30-11:30am, June 20-21, 23-24 (not on June 22) - \$110

CURRICULUM: Engineering is Elementary (EiE)

- Developed by the NATIONAL CENTER FOR TECHNOLOGICAL LITERACY at the Museum of Science, Boston.
- **Integrates engineering with elementary science topics.**
 - **Goal: to increase children's technological literacy**
 - Knowledge (Know about):
 - What engineering and technology are what engineers do
 - Various fields of engineering
 - Nearly everything in the human world has been touched by engineering
 - Engineering problems have multiple solutions
 - How society influences and is influenced by engineering
 - How technology affects the world (both positively and negatively)
 - Engineers are from all races, ethnicities and genders
 - Skills/Experience (Be able to):
 - Apply the Engineering Design Process
 - Apply Science and math in engineering
 - Employ creativity and careful thinking to solve problems
 - Envision one's own abilities as an engineer
 - Troubleshoot and learn from failure
 - Understand the central role of materials and their properties in engineering solutions.

Most humans spend over 95% of their time interacting with technology. Pencils, chairs, water filters, toothbrushes, cell phones and building are all technologies – solutions designed by engineers to fulfill human needs and wants. To understand the world we live in, it is vital that we foster engineering and technology literacy among all people, even young children! Fortunately, children are born engineers- they are fascinated with building, with taking things apart and with how things work.

This project harnesses children's natural curiosity to promote learning of engineering and technology concepts.

CLASS DESCRIPTION: Calling all builders and engineers! In this class, students will learn to distinguish between beam, arch, and suspension bridges and find out how bridge designs counteract and redirect forces and motion. In this hands on class students will design, construct, and test their own bridges. (Calling all Pre-engineers and builders – this class is for you!)

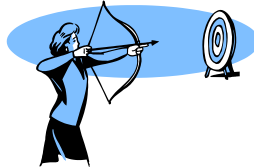
INSTRUCTOR: Miss Ruth Erickson has been teaching for four years. All of these years have been at NCA in both fourth and second grade. She has a *Master In Teaching* degree from Northwest University. Ruth’s father is a civil engineer and has worked with bridge inspection at his job. His curiosity in bridge structures has inspired Miss Erickson to pursue her own interest in how these important structures are created. Inspiring children to use science, math, and creativity to learn from bridge construction are skills Miss Erickson desires to pass on to others.

“BULLS-EYE” ARCHERY ACADEMY

A SAFE Introduction to Field Archery

Grades 3-9, 1:00-3:00pm, June 20-21, 23-24 (not on June 22) - \$110

CLASS DESCRIPTION: This outdoor education class is a great chance to develop hand-eye coordination and to become familiar with the skills and lore of traditional archery. Participants will have the opportunity to learn traditional, instinctive archery using longbows strung with hand-made Flemish-twist bowstrings. We will also use wooden arrows with target tips and real turkey and wild goose feathered fletching. Students will learn range safety, scoring methods, and proper shooting technique. Skill level and bow weights are suitable for students going into grades 3-9.

INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Fred Erickson is an avid traditional archer who regularly practices with both re-curve bows and longbows. He enjoys building his own arrows, bowstrings, and other archery equipment. Over the last five years he has introduced scores of young people (and not a few of their dads) to the fun and fascination of setting shafts in flight toward distant targets. Mr. Erickson is a middle school teacher at Northshore Christian Academy, where he has been on staff for the last seven years.

COOKING TIME MACHINE

Grades 1-9, 9:30-11:30am, June 27-29, July 1 (not on June 30) - \$110

CLASS DESCRIPTION: If you love to cook and love to eat, this is the class for you. Come and join us as we learn what people from different points in US history loved to eat! For example, we will be making one of George Washington's favorite desserts, cherry pie. Our Jr. Chefs will be writing the recipes down as we journey through time. Students will also learn safe cooking techniques and about how to work as a team. Bring your creativity, roll up your sleeves, and get ready to cook!

INSTRUCTOR: Mrs. Krissy Boyd, has been using her culinary gifts to bless others for many years and loves to teach others safe and fun culinary practices. She takes great pleasure in the study of history as well (in fact she has a BA in it) and enjoys connecting her love of history with her affection for creating culinary masterpieces. Mrs. Boyd has been teaching for 6 years. Two of these years have been at Northshore Christian Academy.

RAMP-UP-READING (Small Group Tutoring)

Grades 2-4, 1:00-3:00pm, June 27-29, July 1(not on June 30) - \$85

CLASS DESCRIPTION: Do you want a fun, fabulous way to ramp up your reading? Come try the Reader's Workshop! Reader's Workshop is an interactive, strategy based class that takes a personal approach to reading. The concept is simple: "**TO-WITH-BY**"! The teacher gives a lesson **TO** the students in an INTERACTIVE read-aloud (Every student receives a photocopy of the story to take home). Then the students will engage themselves **WITH** the teacher during "Turn-and-Talk" questions (Every student receives a reading folder for notes).

Finally, the students will practice the strategies **BY** themselves while reading books of their choice! (This is 1-on-1 guided reading time). During the independent reading time, students will get to relax and take their shoes off while laying on their own pillows and sleeping bags! Reading is FUN! To end the week, we will celebrate with a TREAT from the exact recipe from our read-aloud book! They won't want to miss it!

INSTRUCTOR: Mrs. Jody Urban is the current 4th grade teacher at Northshore Christian Academy. Mrs. Urban has a Masters Degree in Teaching and has 4 years teaching experience at the primary

school level. She has an absolute passion for literacy, and reading is one of her favorite subjects to teach! Mrs. Urban really enjoys hands-on activities and the great outdoors. She is a tri-athlete and sports player, as well as a huge fan Seattle professional teams. CLASS DESCRIPTION: Sport stacking originated in the early 1980's in southern California and received national attention in 1990 on a segment of the "Tonight Show", with Johnny Carson. That was where it first captured the imagination of Bob Fox, who was then an elementary classroom teacher in Colorado.

Speed Stacks founder Bob Fox says, "When I first became passionate about sport stacking in 1995, a lot of people would hear about it and scratch their heads. Stacking a sport? The only way to explain it was to show them firsthand - sport stacking is truly something you have to see to believe! I absolutely love the challenge of turning skeptics into believers, and the list of stacking enthusiasts grows every day."

What are the benefits of sport stacking? Kids don't need to be convinced about the benefits of sport stacking. They just plain love it!

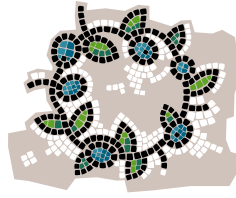
For teachers and parents, Speed Stacking has always touted hand-eye coordination, quickness and ambidexterity. We now can substantiate those claims. A university study by Dr. Brian Udermann, currently at the University of Wisconsin-Lacrosse, confirms that stacking improves hand-eye coordination and reaction time by up to 30 percent.

INSTRUCTOR: Mr. Donohue has just completed his first year as an administrator and instructor at NCA. He comes to us from Bozeman, Montana where he taught three years at Heritage Christian School. During his time at Heritage, Mr. Donahue started a Speed Stacking program in his physical education classes. Each of Mr. Donahue's PE classes from kindergarten through ninth grade participated in the program both during school and after school. Mr. Donahue touts both the learning and competitive aspects of Speed Stacking as an activity that benefits students cognitively and physiologically. "Speed Stacking is an activity your son or daughter will enjoy and can actively participate in for years."

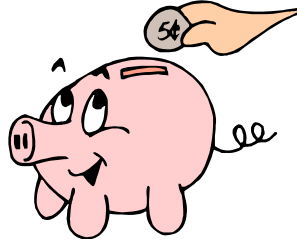

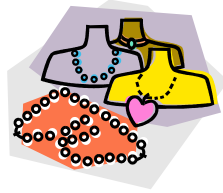

She taught Robotics this year at NCA along with Science Adventures in the NCA School of Enrichment After School Program.

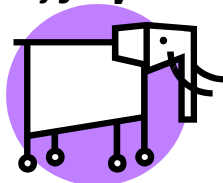

CLASS DESCRIPTION: This course introduces students to the basic techniques of drawing human and animal characters in cartoon and animation style. Students learn to give expression; action and motion to their characters as they create gag cartoons, caricatures, 3d animation, and comic strips. As students gain experience with black and white drawing materials, they become more

confident draftsman and become familiar with rendering as a basis for comic and animation exaggeration students will also learn to use watercolor, pen and ink, color pencil for animation and cartooning. Young artists are encouraged to expand upon their drawing and cartooning skills and to develop their own signature styles.

INSTRUCTOR: Amazing artist and teacher Christine Awad Schmalz is a working artist and Mukilteo resident. She has a Mukilteo studio as well as a studio in Texas. CLASS DESCRIPTION: Calling all young ladies! Do you want to reflect yourself in a positive, pretty manner? Do you want others to look at you with respect? Well, come join Mrs. Urban and learn the basics in etiquette. With giggles, role-play and hands on activities, this will be a class to remember! We will cover topics such as, Proper Introductions, Table Time and Body Basics. "Proper Introductions" is all about respect, showing kindness to friends and meeting new people. 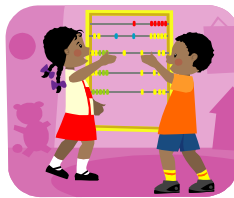
